IDFR at a Glance

IDFR at a Glance

Established in 1991, the Institute of Diplomacy and Foreign Relations, or IDFR in short, has been the training arm of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia since 2004.

Centrally located in Kuala Lumpur, the Institute trains Malaysian diplomats in the areas of diplomacy, international relations, soft skills and foreign languages. IDFR also trains diplomats from among the 139 countries under the Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme as well as the ASEAN Secretariat and Colombo Plan in the areas including diplomatic training, strategic analysis and crisis management.

The Institute also offers a one-year Master of Social Science in Strategy and Diplomacy, a joint programme with Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia which is entering its 17th year and commences in September every year.

In 2016, IDFR will be celebrating the 25th anniversary of its establishment and in line with the Malaysian Government Transformation Programme, IDFR has recently embarked on its own transformation exercise. IDFR has now shifted from being a training institute to a learning institute and is driven by subject matter experts from the diplomatic field, civil service and the private sector.

The Institute is now made up of four learning centres:

- 1. Centre for Political Studies and Economic Diplomacy
- 2. Centre for Leadership, Negotiation and Public Diplomacy
- 3. Centre for Language and Cultural Diplomacy
- 4. Competency Enhancement Centre

To complement the learning, discourses comprising lectures, forums, round table discussions, seminars and workshops are also organised in collaboration with relevant partners, and to date, prominent figures who have addressed audience at IDFR include Kofi Annan, Yasser Arafat, Benazir Bhutto, Nelson Mandela, Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah, Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad, Imam Feisal Abdul Rauf, Ban Ki-moon, Gareth Evans, Helen Clark, Tunku Zain Al-'Abidin Tuanku Muhriz and His Royal Highness Sultan Nazrin Muizzuddin Shah ibni Almarhum Sultan Azlan Muhibbuddin Shah, the Sultan of Perak Darul Ridzuan and the Institute's Royal Patron. Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP): Diplomatic Training Course for International Participants 2016

14 March-1 April 2016 (Three weeks)

Diplomacy today is multi-faceted. It involves, among others, promoting goodwill for the purpose of protecting state policies, national security and interests. In the process, it may require diplomatic agents to engage with their counterparts, governmental and non-governmental organisations, media, multinational corporations and other entities through communications, dialogues and negotiations, thus the need for young diplomats to grasp necessary knowledge and skills pertaining to the craft of diplomacy and their effective application. Also critical is for young diplomats to keep abreast with current issues of common concern as diplomacy is invariably intertwined with international relations, politics and economy.

This course offers a comprehensive module to cover precisely the specific needs of junior and mid-career diplomats. To optimise the learning process, a blended learning approach is applied through interactive classroom lectures, discussions, simulation exercises, visits and briefings.

By the end of this course, committed and active participants will be able to:

- * Better understand the current and changing roles of diplomats;
- * Acquire practical knowledge about the process of negotiations and relevant techniques;
- * Gain insights into cultural peculiarity in negotiations;
- * Analyse and predict future scenarios in a strategic and systematic manner and relate them to their work:

Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP): Crisis Management for International Participants 2016 9-27 May 2016 (Three weeks)

Crises can occur anytime and anywhere around the world causing casualties and property losses. Good crisis management can make a big difference to whether an exodus is efficient or becomes a major catastrophe. To survive against all odds, diplomats and civil servants must be able to forecast and manage crises well and in a timely manner – an increasingly important aspect of diplomacy today.

This course is designed to provide diplomats and civil servants with insights on theories, strategies and issues related to international crisis management. With highlights on Malaysia's experience in managing the tragic incidents involving MH370 and MH17, participants will be able to enhance their knowledge and skills in the various approaches and techniques in managing crises. A blended learning approach is applied through interactive classroom lectures, discussions, simulation exercises, visits and briefings.

By the end of this course, committed and active participants will be able to:

- * Understand the fundamentals of international crisis management operations;
- * Enhance their crisis management skills and techniques;
- * Equip themselves with tools required to identify, assess and cope with a crisis situation; and

Workshop on Public International Law 1-3 June 2016 (Three days)

Public International Law lays the basis for order and peace internationally as it governs relations between independent states and other actors such as governmental and non-governmental organisations in their dealings with each other. The reach on the subject of Public International Law such as on international trade and human rights is extensive. Therefore, it is important for government officers especially those involved in the handling of international affairs to acquire knowledge of at least the basics of Public International Law in discharging their professional responsibilities.

This workshop is designed to introduce Malaysian government officers to the main aspects of public international law such as questions of diplomatic immunity, the law of treaties, the law of the sea and peaceful settlement of international disputes. Through interactive classroom lectures, experience sharing and group discussions, the participants will be encouraged to think critically, analytically and learn the legal perspective of current issues of shared concerns.

By the end of this course, committed and active participants will be able to:

- * Gain insights into a theoretical and practical understanding of the complicated and ever-changing international legal order, including the role of non-state actors;
- * Learn about the current developments in public international law and their application in international legal and diplomatic practices;
- * Discover how issues relating to the subjects of public international law affect their organisation and everyday life; and
- * Broaden their professional network.



Say it Right: A Course on Pronunciation 19-21 July 2016 (Three days)

Pronunciation matters – believe me! In oral communication, rightly or wrongly the way you speak is one of the first things people notice about you. People will judge your background, education and social standing just by the way you speak. Polishing the way you speak can help in countless ways, not least of all, by developing your confidence and fluency, and generally make you sound intelligent and refined.
