

preceding year, exhibited remarkable resilience and unwavering dedication, conducting a total of 146 training programmes, lectures, publications, and research activities, in the realm of diplomacy and international relations. These initiatives engaged a diverse audience of 4,353 participants from both local and international spheres. The year 2023 stood out as a period marked by significant achievements.

To highlight some notable accomplishment, our annual flagship programme, the Diploma in Diplomacy (DiD) 2023, was successfully completed in four months by a total of 18 Administrative and Diplomatic Service Officers (PTD). In furtherance of fostering women's participation in diplomacy, an international forum entitled "Women in Diplomacy: A Spectrum of Opportunities" was organised, with the support of the Embassy of Ireland in Malaysia and the United Nations in Malaysia, Singapore, and Brunei Darussalam. The forum saw an active participation from 100 foreign and local diplomatic practitioners.

The Institute had organised four IDFR Lecture Series, featuring Cultural Diplomacy and Distinguished Lecture Series, with discussions focusing on various topics ranging from "Good International Citizenship: The Case for Decency" to "When Elephants Fight, Will ASEAN Get Trampled?". The well-known speakers invited included Professor Emeritus Tan Sri Dato' Dzulkifli bin Abdul Razak, Professor Kishore Mahbubani, Her Excellency Frances Adamson AC, and Professor the Hon. Gareth Evans.

IDFR has notably expanded its educational portfolio by introducing new language courses, specifically in Korean and Mandarin, catering to the diverse linguistic needs of our participants. Furthermore,

we successfully executed specialised diplomatic training programmes tailored for Lao PDR, Timor Leste, and Iraq. Additionally, we hosted benchmarking visits for reputable diplomatic training institutes, namely Zimbabwe Foreign Service Institute (ZFSI) and Foreign Service Training Institute of Ghana with a view to fostering international collaboration and facilitating knowledge exchange between institutes.

These accomplishments underscore IDFR's commitment towards excellence and innovation in advancing diplomatic education. As we reflect on these achievements and chart the course for the future, the Institute remains dedicated to its mission of equipping officers in taking on the vagaries of diplomacy and international relations in their respective careers. Moving forward to 2024, IDFR will prioritise continuous improvement in our core business; namely training programmes, research, publication, and consultations.

OVERVIEW



The Institute of Diplomacy and Foreign Relations, or IDFR, functions as the training arm of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia. Established in July 1991, IDFR originating from a basic training module for Malaysia's diplomats to a comprehensive training establishment with a mixed cadre of trainers, administrators, and led by a senior diplomat.

IDFR also extends courses to officers and staff from other ministries and government agencies. Our core objective is to provide the participants with pertinent proficiency, resources and skills to competently portray Malaysia on the global platform. Furthermore, IDFR holds the responsibility to train foreign officials in matters related to diplomatic skills, practices, and international relations.


IDFR's flagship programmes include the following:

- a) Diploma in Diplomacy four-month intensive course designated for junior Malaysian diplomats, preparing them for their first assignment Malaysian Missions overseas. The course modules cover bilateral and multilateral facets of international relations, ASEAN, protocol, negotiations, public diplomacy, foreign languages, and administration and finance;
- b) Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) training courses provided to international participants through the scope of the MTCP. These courses include areas of diplomatic training, strategic analysis, and crisis management; and
- c) Pre-Posting Orientation Course for Home-Based Staff and Spouses under the Sistem Pentadbiran Kerajaan Malaysia (SPKM) di Luar Negeri catered for officers from other ministries who are about to be posted abroad.

On occasion, IDFR course participants, students and trainees have distinct opportunities to attend seminars, workshops, and roundtable discussions. They also get the chance to gain insights from notable scholars and global leaders through keynote addresses and lectures. Notable personalities like UN Secretaries General, Kofi Annan and Ban Ki-moon, Haris Siladzjic (Bosnia), Lee Hsien Loong (Singapore), Sultan Hassanal Bolkiah (Brunei Darussalam), Helen Clark (UNDP Chief Administrator), Benazir Bhutto

(Pakistan), Yassir Arafat (Palestine), and Nelson Mandela (South Africa) have delivered distinguished lectures at IDFR.

As one of the agencies under the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia, IDFR's strategic direction is designed to align with the Ministry's objectives. IDFR is committed to deliver top-notch training programmes and produce pre-eminent diplomats who will promote Malaysia's interests nationally and internationally.

CENTRE FOR POLITICAL STUDIES AND ECONOMIC DIPLOMACY

The Centre for Political Studies and Economic Diplomacy (PSED) focuses its training and publications on areas of diplomacy, international relations, security, as well as bilateral, multilateral, political, economic and trade relations. The Centre also conducts programmes under the Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) on subjects related to political studies and economic diplomacy. Additionally, the Centre organises intellectual discourses on relevant topical issues through IDFR Lecture Series.

Aside from training programmes, the Centre manages the biannual publication titled *Foreign Relations*, an impartial writing platform where articles are written by highly knowledgeable and experienced practitioners in the field of diplomacy and international relations. Furthermore, PSED publishes the IDFR 'Let's Talk' series, a talk show featuring subject-matter experts in the area of international relations.

Crisis Management and Preparedness Programme

The Crisis Management and Preparedness programme is a training programme to equip Malaysian civil service officials with the knowledge and skills in managing crises more effectively and efficiently while serving abroad. Among the modules conducted in the course were *Introduction*

to Conflicts and Crises; Tipping Points; Role of National Security Council (MKN) and National Disaster Management Agency (NADMA) During Crisis Abroad; Managing Documents and Government Assets; Effective Communication During a Crisis; Fleeing a Mission; as well as Role of Diplomats When Serving Abroad. The third day involved a crisis simulation at IDFR where participants were required to evacuate a Mission located in a country in crisis.



Crisis Management and Preparedness Programme

Two series were conducted in 2023. The first was conducted from 14 to 16 March 2023. It was attended by a total of 13 officers from various ministries and agencies including the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia, Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI), Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security (MAFS), Malaysian External Trade Development Corporation (MATRADE), Malaysian Investment Development Authority (MIDA), Tourism Malaysia, and Royal Malaysian Customs Department (JKDM). Following the pilot programme in November 2022, this is the first series which included participants from other ministries and agencies, apart from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia.

The second series was conducted for participants of the Diploma in Diplomacy (DiD). It was held on 6, 7 and 11 September 2023. Thirteen junior officers from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia and Prime Minister's Department took part in the programme.

Let's Talk: Foreign Policy Challenges in 2023

Let's Talk series is a talk show that discusses current topics of diplomacy and international relations. Let's Talk: Foreign Policy Challenges in 2023 was recorded on 13 April 2023 and aired on IDFR's official YouTube Channel in June 2023. In this episode, three experts analysed current foreign policy issues and challenges faced by Malaysia as well as the country's

foreign policy agenda in relation to Malaysia MADANI. The panellists invited were former Foreign Minister of Malaysia, Tan Sri Dr Syed Hamid Albar; former Member of Parliament for Batu Kawan, Ms Kasthuriraani Patto; and Professor at the Department of Strategic Studies, National Defence University of Malaya (UPNM), Professor Hajah Ruhanas Harun. The session was moderated by Mr Shahril Nizam Abdul Malek, Principal Assistant Secretary, Southeast Asia Division, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia.

Workshop on Southeast Asia in A World of Strategic Competition: Assessing Agency and Options (IDFR-UKM-USIP)

Southeast Asia has long been a strategic stage for major power rivalries. Against this backdrop, IDFR co-organised an international workshop with Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) and the United States Institute of Peace (USIP) titled, Southeast Asia in a World of Strategic Competition: Assessing Agencies and Options from 21 to 22 June 2023.

The Workshop discussed the impact of strategic competition between the United States and China on Southeast Asia and how countries in the region navigate the changing power dynamics in Asia. It also analysed how Member States of ASEAN can together manage these challenges more effectively. A Policy Roundtable was held as a closed-door session, where two guest speakers, Y.M. Dato' Raja Nushirwan Zainal Abidin, Director-General of National Security Council; and YB Liew Chin Tong, the then Deputy Minister of International Trade and Industry Malaysia (MITI), spoke on relevant policies in relation to the strategic competition in the region.

A total of 20 participants from Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and Vietnam attended the Workshop. Malaysia was represented by several ministries and agencies, including the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia, National Security Council, and the Prime Minister's Department.

IDFR Distinguished Lecture Series 1/2023: Professor Kishore Mahbubani

The first IDFR Distinguished Lecture Series on 6 July 2023, featured the renowned Professor Kishore Mahbubani. The lecture titled, When Elephants Fight, Will ASEAN Get Trampled?, was held at the IDFR Auditorium with the attendance participants various of 188 from organisations, including diplomatic corps, government officials, corporate leaders, and members of academia from think tanks and universities. Twenty officers from Malaysian Missions abroad have also joined the lecture online.


Professor Mahbubani, a Distinguished Fellow at the Asia Research Institute, National University of Singapore, shared insights from his 33 years of diplomatic experience with the Singapore Foreign Service. Notable career milestones include serving as Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Singapore's Permanent Representative to the United Nations (UN), and President of the UN Security Council.

The event commenced with a welcoming remark by Dato' Dr Shazelina Zainul Abidin, Director General of IDFR, and was moderated by Dato Dr Ilango Karuppannan, Adjunct Professor at University Malaya and also former Malaysia's High Commissioner to Singapore.

In the one-hour talk, Professor Mahbubani delved into the geopolitical tensions between the United States and China, emphasising ASEAN's crucial role amid this great power competition. He likened ASEAN to a valuable Ming vase, highlighting its economic growth, global FDI, and growing trade relations with the US and China. Despite speculations about ASEAN's lifespan, Professor Mahbubani noted its resilience compared to other regional organisations.

Describing "the elephants" as the US-China rivalry, he pointed out the absence of a common narrative, highlighting that the contest affects every country differently. Professor Mahbubani attributed the contest to the iron law of geopolitics, asserting that no great power willingly relinquishes its top position.

Emphasising the precious value of ASEAN, he warned against its potential destruction in the geopolitical competition. Professor Mahbubani concluded by urging attention to the two elephants, stating, "it is very important for us to understand how precious ASEAN is because they are about to destroy something precious to us."

MTCP: Diplomatic Training Course for International Participants

This year, the Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP): **Diplomatic** Training Course for International Participants was conducted in a face-to-face format again following the post-COVID pandemic. The course, held from 23 July to 1 August 2023, brought together fifteen diplomats from Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brunei, Cambodia, Fiii, Ghana, Kazakhstan, Laos, Maldives, Mexico, Pakistan, Philippines, Senegal, Sri Lanka, and Türkiye in Kuala Lumpur.

Over the ten-day duration, participants gained practical exposure to diplomacy in Malaysia and valuable insights into diplomatic skills and foreign relations. The training sessions, conducted at IDFR and in collaboration with the International Cooperation and Development Division (ICADD) at Wisma Putra, covered modules such as Malaysia's Foreign

Policy; Bilateral and Multilateral Diplomacy Practices: Malavsia and ASEAN; Crisis Management; Economic Diplomacy; Role of Public Diplomacy in Foreign Policy; Strategic Leadership and Management for Officers; Media Relations and Skills; International Negotiations; Futurist Thinking; and Protocol Practices and Diplomatic Etiquette. Each session featured distinguished speakers from the diplomatic corps, serving officers, subject matter experts, and academia.

The participants also explored Malaysia through various study visits, including the Kuala Lumpur Craft Complex, Kuala Lumpur City Centre, Heritage Trail around Central Market and Merdeka Square, Cultural Show at the Malaysia Tourism Centre (MATIC), and a session on Malaysian Cultural Delicacies. Additionally, visits to administrative centres in Putrajaya and landmarks such as Putrajaya International Convention Centre and Putrajaya Mosque, along with a state visit to Malacca, provided insights into the country's development and historical background.



MTCP: Diplomatic Training Course for International Participants

A certificate presentation ceremony was held on the last day, marking the successful completion of the course. Notable attendees included H.E. Abdoulaye Barro (Ambassador of Senegal), H.E. Air Chief Marshal Dabare Liyanage Sumangala Dias (High Commissioner of Sri Lanka), H.E. Ali Hussain Didi (High Commissioner of the Republic of Maldives), H.E. Irfan

Davudov (Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic Azerbaijan), and of Minister Luis Enrique Verti (Chargé d'affaires of the Embassy of Mexico in Malaysia), along representatives various with from embassies celebrating the participants' achievements.

Foreign Policy Discussed 1: Navigating Malaysia's Relations with Türkiye and Saudi Arabia

Foreign Policy Discussed is a roundtable discussion aimed at analysing bilateral multilateral relations issues and relevant to Malaysia's foreign policy. The first Foreign Policy Discussed titled, Navigating Malaysia's Relations with Türkiye and Saudi Arabia was held on 29 August 2023 via Google Meet. Among the panellists were Assoc. Prof. Dr Svaza Farhana Mohamad Shukri, Head of Department, Department of Political Science, IIUM, Datuk Dr Hamzah Kassim, Member of Consultative Council for Foreign Policy (CCFP), and Datuk Zahairi Baharim, Undersecretary, West Asia Division, Ministry of Foreign Affairs as the Discussant. The discussion began with a welcoming remark from the former Minister of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia, The Hon. Dato' Seri Diraja Dr Zambry Abdul Kadir. He hoped for more discussions between subject matter experts and diplomatic practitioners pertaining to relevant bilateral and multilateral issues with interest to Malaysia's foreign policy.

Dr Hamzah highlighted five challenges Malaysia's relations with Türkiye and Saudi Arabia: political change and leadership transition; big power competition; domestic priorities and global engagement; geopolitical and regional differences; and disruptive technologies, which are the next battle for economic and political supremacy. The speaker proposed enhancing Malaysia's ties with Türkiye and Saudi Arabia through multilateral organisations, collaboration with Gulf think tanks, effective publicprivate partnership coordination, and active involvement in resolving conflicts in Muslim minority countries.

Zahairi discussant Datuk as the underlined the importance of recognising the recent Saudi Arabia-Türkiye political alignment, emphasising their focus on Asia for economic development. He advocated for Malaysia to adopt strategic policies, urging significant shifts in perspectives and approaches. Emphasising the involvement of think tanks and institutions, he also stressed the necessity of moving beyond traditional government-to-government diplomacy for effective engagement in this evolving development for both relations.

A total of 23 participants joined the discussion, including The Hon. Deputy Foreign Minister, the Malaysian

Ambassador to Türkiye, Malaysian Consul Generals in Jeddah and Istanbul and the senior officials in Wisma Putra.

Training of Trainers: Crisis Simulation

The Training of Trainers: Crisis Simulation programme was specifically designed to train ten IDFR and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia officials in creating effective crisis simulation for IDFR's Crisis Management and Preparedness programme. An international expert from

the International Crisis Management Conference (ICMC) was selected as the trainer for the programme.

The curriculum included *Pre-Simulation Planning; Scenario and Exercise Design; and Exercise Delivery and Evaluation,* among others. The programme was held from 11 to 14 September 2023 in Kuala Lumpur.

Diplomatic Training Programme for Timor-Leste Participants

Under the trilateral cooperation between Malaysia, Australia, and Timor-Leste, the Diplomatic Training Programme for Timor-Leste Participants was held from 18 to 22 September 2023, in partnership with the ASEAN-Malaysia National Secretariat (AMNS). The goal of this specialised programme was to provide capacity-building assistance for Timor-Leste towards its readiness for ASEAN membership. The programme drew 14 participants consisting of Timor-Leste diplomats and government executives from several ministries.

In five days, the programme covered various classroom lectures, engaging discussions, simulation exercises and multiple study visits. The participants delved further into ASEAN processes and mechanisms through sessions with the ASEAN-Malaysia National Secretariat (AMNS) regarding ASEAN Relations,

International Negotiations in ASEAN and Experience Sharing Session with AMNS. They also had an exclusive session with the Australian High Commission on the Role of Australia as ASEAN Dialogue Partner, as well as a joint session featuring an expert from Australian Defence Department and National Defence University of Malaysia respectively to discuss ADMM-ADMM Plus Mechanisms.

The participants had the privilege of networking with senior officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia, Australian High Commission, as well as the ASEAN Embassies in Kuala Lumpur at dinner receptions. The participants were also given the opportunity to explore administrative centres and notable landmarks in Putrajaya. While in Kuala Lumpur, they visited the iconic Kuala Lumpur Tower and Heritage Trail around Central Market and Merdeka Square, as well as Kuala Lumpur Craft Complex where they were introduced to local Small Medium Enterprise handicraft and arts production for small states.

The programme concluded with a Closing and Certificate Presentation Ceremony, graced by H.E. Joana Veneranda Amaral (Ambassador of the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste), Ms. Clare Gatehouse (Political and Economic Counsellor, Australian High Commission), and Mr. Mohd Suhaimi Ahmad Tajuddin (Deputy Director-General, **ASEAN Economic**

Community Division, ASEAN-Malaysia National Secretariat). All participants were presented with certificates of participation by Ms. Nuryante Mohd Yazid (Director, Centre for Political Studies and Economic Diplomacy, IDFR), symbolising the successful completion of a comprehensive and exciting diplomatic training programme.

Book Launch: Diplomacy Through the Pandemic and **Economic Diplomacy** for Developing Asia

On 26 September 2023, IDFR marked the launch of two significant in-house publications at EQ Hotel Kuala Lumpur. The ceremony was graced by The Hon. Datuk Mohamad Alamin, Deputy Foreign Minister of Malaysia, adding prestige to the occasion. A total of 120 attendees, including distinguished authors, diplomatic corps, government

officials, and members of academia from think tanks and universities, gathered to celebrate this intellectual milestone. Furthermore, 17 serving officers from Missions joined virtually Malaysian through Google Meet, underscoring the broad reach and significance of the publications.

As the training arm of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia, IDFR actively contributes to the discourse on Malaysia's foreign policy and international issues through its publications. The first of the two publications, Diplomacy Through the Pandemic, takes a unique approach by gathering insights from top-notch

Malaysian diplomats who share their experiences and journeys in navigating the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic while serving abroad. Edited by Dato' Dr Shazelina Zainul Abidin, the book is not merely a collection of stories, but a carefully curated portrayal of the daily realities faced by diplomats during the pandemic. The book is divided into regional chapters, shedding light on the varied experiences and resource constraints, such as lockdowns and limited resources, faced by diplomats at their respective posts. In essence, it serves as a commendable compilation of narratives that offer a nuanced understanding of the diplomatic challenges posed by the global health crisis.

Shifting focus to the second publication, *Economic Diplomacy in Developing Asia*, authored by Professor Sufian Jusoh, emerges as a timely and relevant

addition to the discourse on Malaysia and the broader Asian region. Professor Sufian, a highly respected figure in the realm of international trade and economy, brings extensive experience in policy development and consultation programmes at both government and non-governmental levels. Although the stringent pandemic measures posed challenges to a conventional launch in 2021, the book remains a substantial contribution to the national economic discourse. lt particularly resonates with practitioners and policymakers, providing valuable insights into the intricacies of economic diplomacy in the context of developing Asia. Despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, these publications stand as a testament to IDFR's commitment to fostering intellectual discourse and contributing meaningfully to Malaysia's diplomatic and economic landscape.

Foreign Policy Discussed 2: Malaysia's Position Between Indo-Pacific Economic Framework (IPEF) and Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP)

The second Foreign Policy Discussed titled, Malaysia's Position Between Indo-Pacific Economic Framework (IPEF) and Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) was held on 17 October 2023 via Google Meet. Among the panellists were Dr Intan Murnira

Ramli, Senior Policy Fellow of Economic Research Institute for ASEAN and East Asia (ERIA), Professor Dr Sufian Jusoh, Director of Institute of Malaysian and International Studies (IKMAS), and Mr Riaz Abdul Razak, Director of ASEAN Economic Community, ASEAN-Malaysia National Secretariat, Ministry of Foreign Affairs as the Discussant.

During the discussion, Dr Intan Murnira Ramli compared RCEP and IPEF, highlighting the similarities and contrasts between the two international trade agreements. She also addressed the obstacles and benefits for countries participating in IPEF and RCEP, as well as member countries' concerns about their involvement in the FTA. The solutions proposed include the need for

policymakers to ensure that the benefits of international trade are shared by all Malaysians, and the effectiveness of rules to allow international trade while maintaining our standards. Dr Intan said that as a country participating in both agreements, Malaysia can benefit from IPEF and RCEP while proactively minimising the problems.

Prof. Dr Sufian Jusoh discussed the background of IPEF, which is seen as a US economic competitiveness strategy against China in the Pacific region. In terms of trade arrangements with member countries, he believes that IPEF offers the same benefits as RCEP. Therefore, he suggested that Malaysia should take the opportunity to promote the country's products, especially palm oil, to expand its market with foreign countries and establish close cooperation between international industries, especially in improving the protection of the digital economy.

As a discussant, Mr Riaz Abdul Razak emphasised that Malaysia's participation in the FTA is not new, rather it is something familiar. Malaysia has been significantly involved in FTAs to enhance economic and trade integration, particularly in the Southeast Asian region. Malaysia's participation in IPEF and RCEP is seen as aligned with the country's foreign policy objectives strengthening of regional cooperation and multilateralism. Meanwhile, Malaysia's involvement in IPEF and RCEP is expected to stimulate discussions on the two new areas to be explored: clean energy and digital economy.

A total of 45 participants joined the discussion which involved the senior officials in Wisma Putra to discuss ways to strengthen Malaysia's foreign policy at the international level.

Diplomatic Training Programme for Iraqi Participants

The Diplomatic Training Programme for Iragi Participants, held from 22 to 31 October 2023, marked a successful collaboration between Malaysia and Iraq and a testament to their robust partnership initiated during the August visit of Malaysia's Foreign Minister, The Hon. Dato' Seri Diraja Dr Zambry Abd Kadir. The ten-day programme covered crucial diplomatic topics aligned with Irag's foreign ministry interests, featuring experienced speakers from Wisma Putra and other experts. A courtesy call on The Hon, Dato' Seri Diraja Dr Zambry Abd Kadir by the participants was one of the programme's highlights, fostering closer Malaysia-Iraq relations.

The diverse modules included sessions on Narrative Framing, Presentation Skills, Diplomatic Etiquette, Government Service Integrity, Public Diplomacy, Social Media's Role, Counter-Terrorism, and International Negotiations. Networking sessions with various ministries and agencies, including Foreign Affairs, MITI, MATRADE, MOTAC, and SEARCCT, also enhanced the participants' exposure.

Beyond the classroom activities, the participants delved into Malaysia's foreign policies, institutions, cultures, and values through visits to key locations like Wisma Putra, MITI, MATRADE, Putrajaya, Kuala Lumpur Craft Complex, Malaysia Tourism Centre, and iconic landmarks such as the PETRONAS Twin Towers and KL Tower.

The Closing and Certificate Presentation Ceremony concluded the programme with the presence of key figures, including Dato' Syed Mohamad Bakri Syed Abdul Rahman (Director General of IDFR) and spouse, Mdm. Ghada Abduljabbar Dawi (Deputy Head of Mission, Embassy of the Republic of Iraq), Dato' Sri Naresh Mohan (Ramada Hotel's Group CEO, Trinidad Holdings), and Ms. Nuryante Mohd Yazid (Director, Centre for Political Studies and Economic Diplomacy, IDFR).


Diplomacy Through the Pandemic

CENTRE FOR LEADERSHIP, NEGOTIATION AND PUBLIC DIPLOMACY

The Centre for Leadership, Negotiation and Public Diplomacy (LNPD) is responsible for conducting training for Malaysian civil servants in the fields of leadership, negotiation, and public diplomacy. The following are courses conducted by LNPD in the year 2023:

SPKM: Pre-Posting Orientation Course for Home-Based Staff and Spouses (Series 1 to 5)

SPKM course is a mandatory course for government officials and their spouses who will be serving in Malaysia's missions abroad. The course is designed to enhance the participant's knowledge of administration, protocol, consular relations, social etiquette and more. This is in line with the directive on Surat Pekeliling Am Bilangan 2 Tahun 2018 Sistem Pentadbiran Kerajaan Malaysia

(SPKM) di Luar Negeri dated 8 November 2018.

In 2023, the Centre successfully organised two series of SPKM courses for Grade 41 and above officers (an eight-day course) and another two for Grade 38 and below officers (a five-day course). SPKM 1/2023 was held from 30 January to 9 February 2023; SPKM 2/2023 from 27 February to 3 March 2023; SPKM 3/2023 from 13 to 22 June 2023; SPKM 5/2023 from 3 to 12 October 2023. A total of 208 participants, comprising 116 officers and 92 spouses from 20 ministries and government agencies, attended the courses.

Negotiation Course for Junior Level Officers

Recognising the importance of adapting negotiation skills, IDFR took a proactive step in 2023 by organising a comprehensive negotiation course for junior-level officers. The course was conducted from 14 to 16 March 2023 for junior-level officers and diplomats who will be involved in formal and informal negotiations with government and non-government actors locally and internationally. Thirty-seven from the Prime Minister's Department, Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation, Ministry of International Trade and Industry, Ministry of Domestic Trade and Costs of Living, Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture, Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation, Ministry of Higher Education, Election Commission, and Mailis Amanah Rakvat attended the course.

The negotiation course is designed to provide the participants with the principal rules of negotiations and share with them real-life experience of negotiation strategies, processes, tools, and techniques from a Malaysian diplomat. It also aimed to help the participants develop their core competencies towards effective negotiation via interactive lectures, group discussions, and the exchange of experiences with experts in this particular field. This course was expected to enhance the participants' competency and professionalism preparation for the actual negotiation.

Workshop on Lobbying Efforts

The Workshop on Lobbying Efforts was held at the Putrajaya Mariott Hotel from 11 to 12 April 2023. This workshop was conducted at the request of the Ministry of Housing and Local Government Development of Malaysia to assist their officers in preparing for Malaysia's candidature for the Executive Board of UN-Habitat. The esteemed speakers were Dato' Dr Shazelina Zainul Abidin and Ms

Aznifah Isnariah from the Multilateral Department, Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Twelve government officers participated in this workshop to enhance their understanding of the process, approach, and techniques involved in advocating for positions in international organisations. The ultimate goal of the workshop was to secure Malaysia's election to befitting the positions and seats. The course also enables the participants to deepen their knowledge of the essential arrangements following the casting of the vote.

Leadership Course for Junior Level Officers

The Leadership Course for Junior Level Officers was organised from 9 to 11 May 2023. Twenty-seven officers from the Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Transport, Ministry of Investment, Trade and Industry, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Higher Education, Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture, the Malaysian Convention and Exhibition Bureau, National Academy of Arts, Culture and Heritage, Malaysian External Trade

Development Corporation, and *Majlis Amanah Rakyat*, attended the three-day course.

This course was organised to enable the participants to build essential leadership competencies and unleash their leadership potential. Additionally, the course was intended to enhance participants' capabilities to help them accelerate their leadership goals and make a high-impact contribution to their organisations. It also aimed to equip participants with the necessary tools, techniques, and skills to be highly effective leaders.

Public Diplomacy Workshop for Junior Level Officers

Public diplomacy functions as a form of soft power that can improve a country's reputation and exert influence over the development of domestic and international policies. Mastering the skills of managing public diplomacy and media is imperative for Malaysian government officials to help them deliver government policies and information well. In line with this, the Centre successfully organised the *Public Diplomacy Workshop for Junior Level Officers* from 23 to 25 May 2023. It was specially designed for the early-career government officials of grades 41 to 44.

This workshop was attended by 22 participants from the Ministry Defence, Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture, Tourism Malaysia, Department of Chemistry Malaysia, Majlis Amanah Rakyat, Prime Minister's Department, National Art Gallery, Istana Budaya, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Investment, Trade and Industry, Attorney General's Chambers, and Malaysian Handicraft Development Corporation.

three consecutive days, the participants were exposed to various

modules that provided them with unique and crucial insider knowledge through interactive lecture sessions. They also participated actively in engaging activities led by highly qualified experts. In addition, the participants had the opportunity to undergo intensive practical sessions to create media-worthy materials to refine public relations skills. This directly contributes toward effective information propagation that advances the interest of their organisations for online presence and face-to-face press conferences.

International Protocol and Diplomacy Course for Minister's Senior **Private Secretary** (SUSK)

On 31 May 2023 LNPD organised the International Protocol and Diplomacy Course for Cabinet Ministers' Senior Private Secretary (SUSK). The course was held physically at Sofitel Kuala Lumpur Damansara.

Nineteen SUSK from various ministries attended the course. The course was

designed to improve the participants' knowledge of protocol and diplomacy, comprehension of deepen complexities of international relations, and strengthen relations among the participants participants. The exposed to an overview of Malaysia's foreign policy and the importance of teamwork in achieving common goals. The course also emphasises the importance of applying the proper protocol upon dealing with foreign embassies and international organisations as well as during organising international events.

Media Skills Workshop for Mid-Level Officers

The Centre successfully organised the Media Skills Workshop for Mid-Level Officers from 11 to 13 July 2023. The workshop aimed to enhance participants' awareness, knowledge, and skills in handling the media. It is designed for senior government officials of grades 48 and 52 from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Transport, Ministry of Economy, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of International Trade and Industry, Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living, Ministry of Natural Resources, Environment and Climate Change, Ministry of Education,

Ministry of National Unity, Ministry of Youth and Sports, Ministry of Entrepreneur Development and Cooperatives, Malaysian Investment Development Authority, and Majlis Amanah Rakyat.

Throughout the three-day workshop, participants were introduced to some of the best practices in managing public diplomacy through traditional media and current social media. In addition to interactive lectures and knowledge-sharing sessions, the participants also learnt about hands-on practical training in handling questions and answers during press conferences and studio interview sessions through media simulations conducted by media professionals.

Negotiation Course for Mid-Level Officers

Thirty-four participants of grades 48 and 52 from the Ministry of Rural Regional Development, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Defence, Ministry of Human Resource, Ministry of Tourism, Arts and Culture, Ministry of Work, Ministry of Communications and Digital, Ministry of Local Government Development, Ministry of Youth and Sports, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Investment, Trade and Industry, Mailis Amanah Rakvat, Public Service Department, Tourism Malaysia, Malaysia Development Investment Authority, Ministry of National Unity, Ministry of Women, Family and Community Development, Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation, and Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security attended the course from 22 to 24

August 2023. This course was designed to equip the participants with the skills to successfully prepare, undertake, and conclude negotiations in formal and informal settings with the government and non-government actors locally and internationally.

On their journey to master the art and science of negotiation, the participants experienced negotiation simulation, allowing them to participate actively in the activities designed for hands-on experience. Each module was presented in different yet engaging forms, such as simulation exercises, group discussions, and activities where the participants had an active learning experience. Throughout the course, the speakers and participants engaged in a two-way discussion, exchanging views and thoughts on the lectures.



Negotiation Course for Mid-Level Officers

Negotiation Masterclass for the Ministry of Health Officials

The Negotiation Masterclass for the Ministry of Health Officials was conducted from 8 to 10 September 2023 at the Avillion Admiral Cove Port Dickson. This specially tailored training by IDFR at the Ministry of Health's request was organised to assist the Ministry's officials in honing their negotiation abilities with other countries and international organisations. Eighteen

officials of grades 41 to 54 attended this course.

During the course, the participants were exposed to comprehensive negotiation-related modules, which provided valuable insights into the negotiation process from the beginning to the end. In addition to learning theoretical knowledge, they had the opportunity to immerse themselves in a simulation of a multilateral negotiation while learning useful strategies and techniques in the art of negotiation. Each session was delivered by a prominent speaker from the diplomatic corps, serving officers, and subject matter experts.

Leadership Course for Mid-Level Officers

The Leadership Course for Mid-Level Officers was organised from 19 to 21 September 2023. The course was designed for Malaysian government officials at the mid-career level of grades 48 and 52 to enable them to build essential

leadership. Additionally, the course aimed to equip the participants with specific tools, techniques, and skills to be highly effective leaders.

The course was attended by twenty-five officers from various ministries, agencies, and departments of the Malaysian government including the Ministry of Higher Education, Ministry of Women,

Family and Community Development, Ministry of Communications and Digital, Malaysian Development Investment Authority, National Security Council, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Education, Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Ministry of National Unity, Natural Resources, Environment and Climate Change, Ministry of Domestic Trade and Costs of Living, Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation, Ministry of Entrepreneur and Cooperatives

Development, Ministry of Defence, and Ministry of Investment, Trade and Industry.

To help the participants strengthen the essential skills most needed for success, they were exposed to various modules designed to enhance their abilities and hone their potential as future leaders in their workplaces. Throughout the three days, they actively engaged in interactive lecture sessions, role-play exercises, and group discussions.

International Day of Women in Diplomacy 2023 Women in Diplomacy: A Spectrum of Opportunities Forum

IDFR hosted the Women in Diplomacy: A Spectrum of Opportunities Forum on 23 June 2023 at Hilton Kuala Lumpur. The event was supported by the Embassy of Ireland in Malaysia and the United

Nations in Malaysia, Singapore, and Brunei Darussalam. It was held in conjunction with the International Day of Women in Diplomacy, adopted as Resolution 269 of the 76th session of the United Nations General Assembly last year, to be celebrated on 24 June. The event, arranged in a hybrid format, was attended by practitioners, foreign policy influencers, and administrators who work in the field of diplomacy.

This year's theme Women in Diplomacy: A Spectrum of Opportunities focused on the opportunities available for women in the field of diplomacy, either as career diplomats, managers, and administrators within the international diplomacy circles, or even peacekeepers, to recognise the important contributions made, to discuss what gaps exist, and how to address it.

The Hon. Dato' Seri Diraja Dr Zambry Abd Kadir, Minister of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia delivered an inspiring introductory statement via video recording. Prof. Tan Sri Dr Jemilah Mahmood, Former Chief of the World Humanitarian Summit secretariat at the United Nations delivered the keynote address, and the panellists for the forum were Lieutenant Colonel Jayne Lawlor, Brigade Adjutant and Senior Staff Officer Personnel Section and Gender Advisor Second Brigade, Irish Defence Forces and Mrs Karima El Korri, UN resident Coordinator in Malaysia, Singapore, and Brunei Darussalam. The forum was moderated by Ms Aznifah Isnariah Abd Ghani, Undersecretary of the Multilateral Economy and Environment Division, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia.

IDFR Distinguished Lecture Series 3/2023: Professor the Honourable Gareth Evans

The third IDFR Distinguished Lecture Series 2023 was hosted on 23 November 2023, where the Institute was deeply honoured to welcome the profoundly acclaimed Prof. the Hon. Gareth Evans. The lecture series titled, *Good International Citizenship: The Case for Decency*, was held at the IDFR Auditorium.

Prof. Gareth Evans is a Distinguished Honorary Professor at the Australian National University, where he served as a Chancellor from 2010 to 2019, and President Emeritus of the International Crisis Group, a prestigious independent organisation in Brussels dedicated to global conflict prevention and resolution. As a notable figure in Australian politics, Professor Evans served as the Australian Foreign Minister from 1988 to 1996. Among his numerous accomplishments

on mass atrocity crimes and nuclear weapons, Professor Evans has authored or edited 14 books, including his most recent publication *Good International Citizenship: The Case for Decency* (2022).

In his lecture, Professor Evans succinctly outlined three crucial components: The Politics of Decency, which highlights the difficulties posed by cynical governments; The National Interest Imperative, which promotes a cooperative mindset in advancing global and regional public goods: and The Moral Imperative, which emphasises the recognition and respect for our shared humanity as the cornerstone of good international citizenship. Throughout the session, he strongly emphasised how a sensible foreign policy may promote reciprocity, aid in creating soft power, and support the global problem-solving process. The lecture series was attended by over 100 participants from the diplomatic government community, officials, members of academia, Wisma Putra Officers, and officers from Malaysian Missions.

CENTRE FOR LANGUAGES AND CULTURAL DIPLOMACY

The Centre for Languages and Cultural Diplomacy (CLCD) focuses on two main areas: Language and Cultural Diplomacy. It promotes communication skills and cross-cultural understanding; offers language courses in English and other official foreign languages. Cultural Diplomacy, is explored through lectures, workshops, and research projects, aiming to contribute to the intersection of culture and diplomacy.

Say It Right: A Course on Pronunciation

CLCD conducted its in-house course bearing in mind the core features of effective communication from 7 to 9 March 2023. The content of the course was designed to raise the participants' awareness of the English Sound System and the elements influencing effective speech such as intonation, rhythm, word and sentence stress which then combined, illustrate better communicative skills. Besides that, the training content also emphasised the need to shape participants into confident and comfortable speakers through using the right words for clarity while understanding non-verbal cues in their daily engagements, especially in their respective work portfolios.

Twenty-five participants from various ministries and government agencies attended the course. Among them were from the Ministry of Local Government Development of Malaysia, Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation, Ministry of Tourism, Arts, and Culture, Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation, Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Communications and Digital, Parliament Malaysia, Fire and Rescue

Department (Putrajaya), Public Private Partnership Unit, Prime Minister's Department, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and IDFR.

The course helped participants to focus on the problem areas Malaysian speakers of English might encounter in pronouncing certain sounds that are not found in their native language. More importantly, it gave participants the opportunity to exercise these techniques in order for the entire message to be comprehensible to the audience through effective communication.



Say It Right: A Course on Pronunciation

Professional Writing Programme (PWP)

The Centre conducted its newly rebranded English programme, PWP: Professional Writing Programme 2023 from 14 to 16 March 2023. With the consciousness of the English language constantly evolving in nature and the various written platforms we engage in daily life, especially at work, the ELT Trainers at IDFR developed an impactful module to capture the current writing trends.

PWP offered exposure written to components comprising e-mail communications, report and proposal writing, instant messaging and social media writing. Besides that, commonalities in writing cannot be neglected either in the aim of producing an effective piece of writing, thus tones in

writing, precise writing and structuring as well as punctuating correctly were also highlighted in the module.

The programme aimed to create an engaging learning environment for the participants thus practical sessions on e-mail, social media and report writing were infused in the class activities. This was beneficial for the participants when they showed massive interest and engagement in these practical sessions.

Overall, 23 government officers from various ministries such as the Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Human Resource, Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation, Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, Ministry of Higher Education, and Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission, were awarded with a Certificate of Attendance.



PWP: Professional Writing Programme 2023

Secretaries and Personal Assistants Essential English Development (SPEED)

SPEED is a three-day course of 12 two-hour slots with a maximum of 26 participants. Each course is designed by the trainer to meet the needs of its participants and is therefore a unique package targeted to improve business performance in English. This course was held from 31 May to 2 June 2023 at the Vivatel Kuala Lumpur, for the secretaries and personal assistants to equip them with the English language skills that they need for communicative tasks at their workplace. The participants came from various ministries.

The course was designed according to the needs of the learners; in fact, it exposed the common issues and difficulties in actual office work. There was a focus on written and spoken communication skills such as making arrangements, planning

and organising business events, and handling correspondence. It was meant to enhance the foundational skills that the participants had already possessed by providing meaningful information and abstract activities that could be significant in their work. Trainers used presentations, case studies, workshops, and role-play simulations that involved interactive participation.

This three-day course not only helped participants to shed their shyness but also to speak and write more confidently in their work-related matters. They took part actively in activities organised and interacted well with their course mates from different ministries. They were able to develop their English language skills, both verbal and non-verbal, for the improvement of their performance at work. Therefore, having strong communicative skills in the English language is a way of ensuring that secretaries and personal assistants have a somewhat guaranteed form of communication for their day-to day needs in their professions.

Presentation Skills at the Workplace

The Centre for Languages and Cultural Diplomacy (CLCD) carried out its annual course titled "Presentation Skills at the Workplace" at the Institute of Diplomacy and Foreign Relations (IDFR) based on the need for government officers to acquire the skills and techniques of public speaking. No matter what it is or how daunting presenting in a small meeting, giving an update to the entire ministry or agency, or presenting at a conference or other events, participants explored the steps in order to prepare and

improve their skills to speak effectively and eloquently to an audience.

Twenty-one participants from the Ministry of Education, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation, Ministry of Human Resource, Ministry of Finance, Department of Atomic Energy, Islamic Tourism Centre, District Education Office, Academy of Sciences Malaysia, Malaysian Space Academy, and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs joined the course held from 20 June 2023 until 22 June 2023.

This three-day course paved the way to help participants to negate their fear of presenting by knowing their material well, practising relevant verbal and non-verbal strategies and connecting confidently with the audience. Participants successfully followed the correct process of preparing and delivering their

respective presentations whilst receiving constructive comments to better deal with challenges as a presenter and manoeuvring through the art of Public Speaking.

Mastering Communication with Diplomacy (MCD)

Individuals who grasp the art of diplomacy can effectively communicate, negotiate, and resolve issues with empathy, tact, and mutual understanding. Developing these talents takes time, practice, and self-reflection, but the advantages are priceless.

Keeping this in mind, CLCD held a course this year on Mastering Communication with Diplomacy. This course was made available to all government ministries and organisations. This course attracted a total of 26 students. It was held from 6 to 8 September at the Melia Hotel. Ms Sharon Ng from Total English (Zubedy & Co.) led the course.

How successfully you communicate has a direct impact on how people perceive your job and performance, as well as your opportunities for career progression and mobility. Diplomacy and tact do not always come effortlessly, and even when they do, emotions and conflict will have the upper hand in conversation. Being skilled in these areas of communication necessitates awareness, training, and the ability to apply tried-and-true approaches to a wide range of situations.

The instructor's diplomatic approaches of communicating were very well received by the participants. They graduated as more confident and trustworthy communicators.



Mastering Communication with Diplomacy

Arabic Language Level 1

Two series of Arabic Level 1 courses were successfully conducted in 2023. The *Arabic Language Level 1 Series 1/2023* course started on 23 May until 8 August 2023 with 24 participants from various ministries and government agencies, mainly the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industries, the Ministry of Education, the Ministry of Communications and Multimedia, the Ministry of Home Affairs, the Ministry of Human Resources, the Ministry of Housing and Local Government, and the

Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation (MATRADE). The Arabic Language Level 1 Series 2/2023 course was organised from 5 September to 23 November 2023. The 15 participants who enrolled in this second series were from the Energy Commission, Ministry of Natural Resources, Environment and Climate Change, Ministry of Communications and Multimedia, Ministry of Health Malaysia, National Institute of Public Administration, Malaysian Administrative Modernization and Management Planning Unit, MARA Technological University, Royal Malaysian Air Force, and the Malaysia Civil Defence Force.



Arabic online class

This course consisted of 42 contact hours each and was held twice a week, every Tuesday and Thursday from 5.30 to 7.30 pm for a total of 21 sessions. Arabic Level 1 courses were designed to equip the participants with basic knowledge of the Arabic language and culture, the necessary expressions needed to greet and introduce one self and others, and expressions to convey wishes and preferences. This course gave the participants the opportunity to master the skills of listening, speaking and understanding basic conversation in Arabic, which served as a good foundation for them to develop their competencies in the language and instil in them an interest in further acquiring the language.

During the conduct of this course, all participants showed a great interest in the programme and conveyed their interest in pursuing the course at the next level. Participants were encouraged to continue

practicing the basic skills in Arabic gained from this course via the online learning platforms available to sustain the ability enquired.

French Language Level 1

The French Language Course comprising French Language Level 1 Series 1/2023 from 23 May to 8 August 2023 and French Language Level 1 Series 2/2023 from 5 September to 23 November 2023 respectively, has attracted participants from diverse ministries and agencies. In the first series, the 26 participants who enrolled were from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Prime Minister's Department, Ministry of Human Resources, Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, Ministry of

Finance, Ministry of Education, Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation, *Istana Kerajaan Negeri Sembilan*, and Mines Excellence Golf Resort Berhad.

In the second series, there were 18 participants who were from the Ministry of Home Affairs, Prime Minister's Department, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Tourism, Arts, and Culture, Malaysia External Trade Development Corporation, Ministry of Rural Development, Malaysian Maritime Enforcement Agency, National University of Malaysia, PETRONAS, and BERNAMA.



French class

With a schedule of 42 contact hours every Tuesday and Thursday, from 5.30 to 7.30 pm, the course was tailored to furnish participants with essential linguistic and cultural skills. The programme aimed at enhancing language proficiency through a comprehensive focus on listening, speaking, reading, and writing. The structured approach, interactive methodologies, and emphasis on cultural understanding make it a valuable resource

for individuals seeking to enhance their language proficiency and broaden their horizons in the French-speaking countries.

Notably, the commitment and enthusiasm exhibited by all participants during the 21 online sessions were remarkable. These two series of courses were both conducted through Google Meet. Hence, the participants found the courses highly

effective, facilitating easy integration into their schedules after working hours, and they could actively engage in various interactive activities. Overall, the French Language Course Series 1 and Series 2 succeeded in providing a comprehensive and engaging learning experience, fostering both linguistic competence and cultural understanding among its diverse group of participants.

German Language Level 1

In the year 2023, there were two German Language courses conducted under the Centre of Language and Cultural Diplomacy (CLCD), IDFR The courses were German Language Level 1, Series 1/2023 and German Language Level 1, Series 2/2023. These courses were held for 3 months which equalled to 42 teaching hours with 2 sessions conducted every week. (Tuesday and Thursday, from 5.30 pm to 7.30 pm, 2 hours per session) through an online platform (Google Meet). The main objective of the course is to provide a great chance for all participants to achieve a basic level of German Language proficiency to carry out everyday situations and related responsibilities in their general work field. They are also expected to possess good verbal and written communication skills to enable them to understand and disseminate information quickly and effectively.

German Language Level 1 Series 1/2023 began on 23 May to 8 August 2023 with 28 participants. They were from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Local Government Development, Ministry of Tourism, Ministry of Human Resources, Ministry of Education, Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security, Public Service Department Malaysia, Fire and Rescue Department of Malaysia, MATRADE, and ADTEC Melaka. At the end of the course, only 21 participants successfully finished the course and managed to exceed the passing mark for the final examination as the rest withdrew for the course.

German Language Level 1 Series 2/2023 began on 5 September to 23 November 2023 with 16 participants. They were from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Local Government Development, Ministry of Economy, Ministry of Rural and Regional Development, Ministry of Tourism. Ministry of Education, Prime Minister Office, Ministry of Science, Technology and Innovation of Malaysia, Royal Malaysia Police, Fire and Rescue Department Malaysia, MATRADE, Malaysian Investment Development Authority, and National University of Malaysia. Only participants successfully finished the course and managed to exceed the passing mark for the final examination.

At the end of both courses, all 33 participants were able to possess basic

functions of each language skill for basic German Language, understand and able to read short and very simple texts related to daily activities and work. They also managed to understand and comprehend basic conversations using various common phrases in the German Language.

This is the third series since its first instalment on 1 June 2022. The programme aimed to provide newly arrived diplomats with a comprehensive understanding of the diplomatic processes and lifestyle, as well as the culture in Malaysia. The two-day

programme was attended by 15 diplomats representing various foreign embassies and international organisations.

The programme began with a welcoming remark by Mr R. Suresh Kumar, Director of CLCD and featured talks by practitioners from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, BERNAMA TV, and a cultural expert. Throughout the course, the participants managed to gain a glimpse of the peculiarities of Malaysian culture, the workings of the Foreign Ministry, Malaysian Politics, honorifics in Malaysia, the nation's media landscape as well as

Working in Malaysia. One of the sessions included a visit to Wisma BERNAMA where participants were given a tour of the premises.

At the end of the programme, the participants expressed great satisfaction about how much they have learnt about the intricacies of Malaysian life – forming a strong foundation for their diplomatic tenure in Malaysia. On 9 March 2023, Dato' Dr Shazelina Zainul Abidin presented the certificates of attendance to the participants.

Course on Intercultural Communication and Cultural Diplomacy (CICAD)

IDFR organised a highly informative and engaging Course on Intercultural Communication and Cultural Diplomacy (CICAD) from 23 to 24 May 2023. This course aimed to equip the participants with a comprehensive understanding of the key elements, theories, and practices of cultural diplomacy while fostering intercultural awareness.

Twenty-seven participants from ministries attended this training which covered various topics such as Intercultural Communication, Cross-Cultural Communication, Cultural Intelligence, Madani Values in Malaysian Multicultural Society and Cultural Diplomacy and Nation Branding, The participants are from Ministry Investment, Trade and Industry, Ministry of Higher Education, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Science, Technology, and Innovation, Malaysian External Trade Development Corporation, Ministry Agriculture and Food Security, Ministry of Communication and Digital, Department of Chemistry, Malaysia, Department of Federal Territories, Malaysian Administrative Modernisation and Management Planning Unit, Prime Minister's Department and Radio Televisyen Malaysia.

The course was thoughtfully designed to provide practical knowledge through engaging talks, interactive discussions, and stimulating simulation exercises. This approach encouraged active participation and facilitated the exchange of valuable information among the participants. Throughout the duration of the course, the significance of cultural diplomacy and its profound impact on interactions were explored. The participants also managed to gain a glimpse of Wisma Putra's experience in managing its cultural diplomacy through Bilateral and Multilateral Relations.

Overall, CICAD was a resounding success, equipping the participants with the vital knowledge and skills necessary to navigate the complexities of intercultural communication and promote cultural diplomacy in their respective ministries and roles.

Cultural Diplomacy Lecture Series (CDLS)

Cultural Diplomacy Lecture Series (CDLS) exclusive platform an distinguished where personalities, diplomats, senior government officials, academicians, policymakers, and other practitioners share diplomacy their knowledge and insights on topical, current, and relevant issues happening around the world. The lecture series aims to instil awareness of how cultural diplomacy is practised and how it could promote peace, stability, and prosperity globally. The motivation in identifying this scope of discussion is related to several events in the world that highlighted the emergence of the critical role of culture in modern international politics.

The first CDLS for 2023 took place on 26 May 2023 at the Tun Abdul Razak Auditorium, Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Prof. Emeritus Tan Sri Dato' Dzulkifli bin Abdul Razak, the Rector of the International University Malaysia delivered a talk on Cultural Intelligence. The lecture, co-hosted by IDFR and Human Resource Management Division, Wisma Putra, emphasised the significance of cultural intelligence in diplomacy, particularly in navigating diverse cultural contexts. Prof. Dzulkifli highlighted the importance of adapting and integrating oneself into different cultural environments while maintaining one's own identity. Cultural intelligence effective engagement enables collaboration with people from diverse cultures in various domains, including business, government, and academia. The

session drew over 90 participants, including Dato' Cheong Loon Lai, Deputy Secretary General Multilateral Affairs, officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysian Missions abroad, and officers from IIUM.

The second CDLS titled *The Role of Sister Cities in the Comprehensive Strategic Partnership*, was held on 28 August 2023. IDFR and the Australian High Commission jointly organised the lecture series, featuring The Hon. Frances Adamson AC, the Governor of South Australia.

The lecture attracted more than 100 participants, including Dato' Bala Chandran Tharman, Acting Deputy Secretary General, Management Services, Diplomatic Corp, officials from other government agencies, international organisations, academia, as well as non-governmental organisations.

International Diplomacy: Communication and Culture (CIDCC)

IDFR in collaboration with the Public Health Development Division, Ministry of Health (MOH) organised an inaugural course on International Diplomacy: Communication and Culture from 2 to 3 August 2023. The course was attended by 40 participants from MOH who are under the ASEAN Health Cluster Focal Points.

Taking in the importance of having crosscultural understanding and awareness in dealing with ASEAN affairs, the modules for the course were designed to enhance the knowledge and skills related to international diplomatic practices, intercultural communication, and cultural diversity. The participants were also exposed to sessions that made up of knowledge sharing on Cultural Diplomacy in the ASEAN Arena, Cross-cultural and Intercultural Communication, the Effects of Culture on Bilateral and Multilateral Relations, Language and Diplomacy, Cultural Intelligence, and Developing Cultural Competence and Diplomacy based on MADANI Related Values. The course also touched on Official Correspondence in which the participants were exposed to techniques and skills in drafting interventions, concept notes, and report writing.

Through engaging lectures, sharing sessions and interactive activities, the participants gained a comprehensive understanding that extended beyond cultural competency. They also became more conscious of their 'identity' that one should possess as a Malaysian and recognised the importance of adhering to diplomatic procedures while prioritising national interest.

Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP): Cultural Diplomacy

The Centre organised a Cultural Diplomacy course under the Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) from 5 to 14 September 2023. The course was attended by 16 participants from 15 countries, namely Azerbaijan, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Cambodia, Cameroon, Indonesia, Kyrgyz, Malaysia, Maldives, Mongolia, Namibia, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Uzbekistan, and Viet Nam.

The course is designed to provide midcareer diplomats under the South-South Cooperation initiative substantive input on aspects of cultural values, beliefs and perceptions between diverse cultural groups. The aspects of intercultural communications were emphasised to raise the participants' awareness on how the psyche of a society could determine the way people from different cultural and ethnic backgrounds interact with each other.

Among the special focus areas given were Cultural Diplomacy in the ASEAN Arena, Conceptual Framework of Culture and Diversity, Humanising Diplomacy thru Culture, Language and Diplomacy and Cultural Dimensions in Negotiations. In addition, there were also lectures on Cross-Cultural Communication and Interactive Malay for Daily Conversation. These modules enlightened participants on the role of culture in international relations and the way cooperation between Governments could be achieved through cultural diplomacy.

Throughout the course, participants engaged in a wide range of enriching learning experiences. These experiences included interactive lectures, inspiring group discussions, immersive simulation exercises, and insightful case studies.

Furthermore, participants had the privilege of visiting the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, where they actively participated engaging sessions with Desk Officers representing various countries. Additionally, they had the opportunity to visit PETRONAS Twin Towers, where they received a comprehensive briefing on PETRONAS's unwavering commitment to progress. This visit was further enhanced by an excursion to the observation deck at level 86, which provided them with breathtaking views. Participants also had the chance to immerse themselves in the world of international trade at the Malaysia International Halal Showcase (MIHAS). 

COMPETENCY ENHANCEMENT CENTRE

The Competency Enhancement Centre (CEC) manages one of IDFR's long-term flagship programmes, the Diploma in Diplomacy (DiD), a preparatory course for the junior officers of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Malaysia, prior to their first posting abroad. The Centre also conducts specialised training courses for selected groups of individuals from time to time. CEC aims to provide opportunities to participants to build on and further enhance their knowledge, skills, and experience not only in diplomatic, foreign policy, international relations, and strategic theories, but also in practical applications. Ultimately, the Centre envisages moulding competent and inquisitive individuals who are better aware of the shifting global political and economic climate, to contribute to the progress of Malaysian diplomacy.

Diploma in Diplomacy (DiD) 2023

The Diploma in Diplomacy (DiD) is an annual flagship programme of IDFR to expose junior Administrative and Diplomatic Officers from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Prime Minister's Department to various angles of diplomatic affairs and international relations prior to their first assignment in Malaysia's diplomatic missions abroad.

DiD 2023 was held from 8 May to 15 September 2023. The centre received a

total of 18 participants of which 15 of them were from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and three from the Prime Minister's Department.

The participants were exposed to various leadership and diplomacy courses through practical lessons, lectures, briefings, simulation and role-play exercises and excursions. Among them are Defending National Interest (DNI), drafting of Annual Leaders Retreat (ALR) document, simulation on ASEAN Summit and Related Meetings and drafting of UN Resolution.

Structured across four comprehensive days, the programme encompassed modules focused on strategic insights








Boosting IT Infrastructure


